AMENDMENT intended to be proposed by Mr. TESTER (for himself and Mr. FRANKEN)

Viz:

1 On page 40, between lines 12 and 13, insert the fol-
2 lowing:

3 (i) The number of cyber threat indica-
4 tors and defensive measures shared under
5 this Act, including a breakdown of—

6 (I) the total number of cyber
7 threat indicators shared through the
8 capability described in section 5(c);

9 (II) a good faith estimate of the
10 number of cyber threat indicators
11 shared by entities with civilian Fed-

1 eral entities through capabilities other
2 than those described in section 5(e);

3 (III) a good faith estimate of the
4 number of cyber threat indicators
5 shared by entities with military Fed-
6 eral entities through capabilities other
7 than those described in section 5(e);

8 (IV) the number of times per-
9 sonal information or information that
10 identifies a specific person was re-
11 moved from a cyber threat indicator
12 shared under section 5(e);

13 (V) an assessment of the extent
14 to which personal information or in-
15 formation that identifies a specific
16 person was shared under this Act
17 though such information was not nec-
18 essary to describe or mitigate a cyber-
19 security threat or security vulner-
20 ability;

21 (VI) a report on any known
22 harms caused by any defensive meas-
23 ure operated or shared under the au-
24 thority of this Act;

1 (VII) the total number of times
2 that information shared under this
3 Act was used to prevent, investigate,
4 disrupt, or prosecute any offense
5 under title 18, United States Code,
6 including an offense under section
7 1028, 1028A, or 1029, or chapter
8 37 or 90 of such title 18; and

9 (VIII) the total number of times
10 that information shared under this
11 Act was used to prevent, investigate,
12 disrupt, or prosecute a terrorism of-
13 fense under chapter 113B of title 18,
14 United States Code.
